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# ALL INDIA INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES VIJAYPUR, JAMMU

## **Introduction:**

All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Vijaypur, Jammu is one amongst the several new AIIMS, being established under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India. The short-term objective of establishing new AIIMS in various parts of India is to reduce the 'gaps' in affordable Tertiary Healthcare and long-term vision is to generate 'wellness' amongst the general population of India. AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu is under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY). It came into existence as an Institute of National Importance through Central Government Gazette Notification dated 04<sup>th</sup> December 2019. Establishment of AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu has been done under PMSSY (Phase-V) in a bid to correct regional imbalance in availability of affordable /reliable Tertiary Healthcare services and to cater for people residing in far flung areas of UT of Jammu & Kashmir, adjoining regions of Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and rest of the country.

The foundation stone of AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu was laid by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji on 03<sup>rd</sup> February 2019. It was followed by Bhoomi Pujan Ceremony by Dr Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Earth Sciences, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Science & Technology, Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, Minister of State in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Minister of State in the Department of Atomic Energy and Minister of State in the Department of Space, Government of India on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2020. AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu is still in its construction phase as in year 2020-21 and progressing satisfactorily. AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu shall be a 750 bedded hospital in phase-I, with multiple specialities as well as super speciality departments. The project cost of construction is about 1661 crores, which includes an allocation of Rs 185 crores towards state-of-the-art medical equipment. The Government of Jammu has allotted about 227 acres of land (including expansion for phase-II & phase-III of the Institute) for the project and shall take care of access roads, water facilities and provision of electricity connection.

Governance Structure: The Governance structure is depicted in figure-1

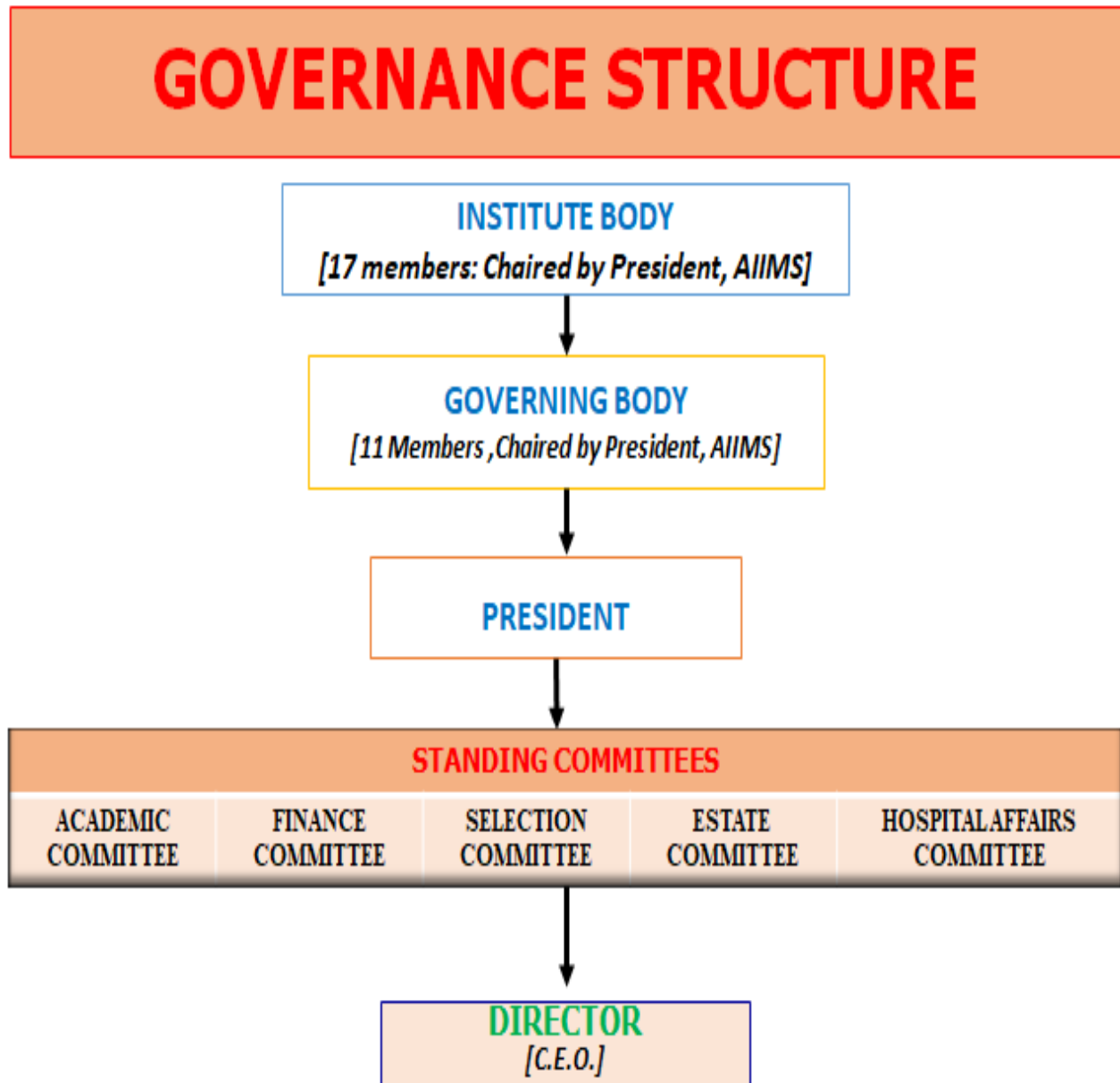


Figure -1: Governance Structure

We have audited the Balance Sheet of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Vijaypur, Jammu as at 31 March 2020, Income & Expenditure Account and Receipts & Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19 (2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Power and Conditions of Service) Act 1971 read with section 18 (2) of The All India Institutes of Medical Sciences Act, 1956. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Institute's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/ CAG's Audit Reports, separately.

3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.

4. Based on our audit, we report that:

## **A. Income & Expenditure Account**

### **A.1 Income**

#### **Grants/ Subsidies (Schedule 13): ₹ 80.65 crore**

As per the Accounting Policy at Sl.no.9.3 contained in the Schedule 24 of the format of accounts prescribed by the Ministry of Finance, Government Grants/ subsidies should be accounted on realisation basis.

Grant of ₹ 80.65 crore was not realized in the financial year 2019-20 as the same was realized by the Institute in April 2020 i.e. in the financial year 2020-21. According to aforesaid accounting policy as laid down in the prescribed format, as the grant was not realised in the financial year 2019-20, it should not have been accounted for in the annual accounts for the year 2019-20. However, the Institute has booked the same as Income as well as Receivable in the annual accounts. This has resulted in overstatement of Income as well as Current Assets, Loans, Advances etc. by ₹ 80.65 crore.

### **A.2 Expenditure**

#### **Other Administrative Expenses etc. (Schedule 21): ₹ 10.02 lakh**

Above amount was paid by the Institute towards stamp duty applicable for HEFA loan agreements. As the expenditure is of capital nature, the amount should have been booked as Capital Work in Progress. This has resulted in overstatement of Expenditure and understatement of Capital Work in Progress by ₹ 10.02 lakh.

## **B. Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts**

Net impact of Audit comments on the annual accounts of the Institute for the year ending 31 March 2020 is as under:

- i. Assets overstated by ₹ 80.55 crore;
- ii. Reserves and Surplus overstated by ₹ 80.55 crore. Besides the Surplus is overstated by ₹ 80.55 crore.

## C. Grant-in-aid

The financial year 2019-20 was the first financial year of the Institute. In the financial year 2019-20, no grants were received<sup>1</sup> by the Institute. Financial activities of the Institute were done through the loan taken of ₹ 1.10 crore<sup>2</sup> from the mentor Institute, All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Rishikesh.

v) Subject to our observations in the preceding paragraphs, we report that the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account/Receipts & Payments Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts.

vi) In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said financial statements read together with the Accounting Policies and Notes on Accounts, and subject to the significant matters stated above and other matters mentioned in Annexure to this Audit Report give a true and fair view in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in India:

- a. In so far as it relates to the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), Vijaypur, Jammu as at 31 March 2020; and
- b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

## **A. Balance Sheet**

### **Capital Fund and Liabilities**

#### **Reserves and Surplus (Schedule 2): ₹ 85.31 crore**

**A.1** As per General Financial Rule 230 (8), all interests or other earnings against Grants in aid or advances (other than reimbursement) released to any Grantee institution should be mandatorily remitted to the Consolidated Fund of India immediately after finalisation of the accounts. Such advances should not be allowed to be adjusted against future releases.

It has been observed that the Institute has earned an interest income of ₹ 1.85 crore during the year 2020-21. However, interest on grant funds was neither remitted to the Government, nor provision for remitting the same was booked in the accounts. This has resulted in understatement of Current Liabilities and Provisions and overstatement of Reserves and Surplus by ₹ 1.85 crore, besides, overstatement of Income of the current year to the same extent.

**A.2** An observation was included in the report on annual accounts of the previous year 2019-20, that an amount of ₹ 10.02 lakh was paid by the Institute towards stamp duty applicable for HEFA loan agreements in the year 2019-20. The expenditure was of capital nature, the amount should have been booked as Capital Work in Progress. Due to impact of the observation, Reserve and Surplus as well as Capital Work in Progress are understated by ₹ 10.02 lakh.

## **B. General**

### **B.1 Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts**

Net impact of Audit comments on the annual accounts of the Institute for the year ending 31 March 2021 is as under:

- i. Assets understated by ₹ 0.10 crore;
- ii. Liabilities understated by ₹ 1.85 crore.
- iii. Reserves and Surplus overstated by ₹ 1.75 crore. Besides, the Surplus is overstated by ₹ 1.85 crore.

**B.2** As per the Accounting Policy at Sl.no.9.3 contained in the Schedule 24 of the format of accounts prescribed by the Ministry of Finance, Government Grants/subsidies should be accounted on realisation basis.

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The Institute has realised grant amounting to ₹ 80.65 crore in the financial year 2020-21. The Institute has not accounted for the same in the current year accounts as it had already booked the same in annual accounts of previous year 2019-20, on sanction basis. Accounting treatment given by the Institute is not in consistent with aforesaid accounting policy laid down in the prescribed format.

- b. In so far as it relates to Income & Expenditure Account, of the surplus for the year ended on that date.

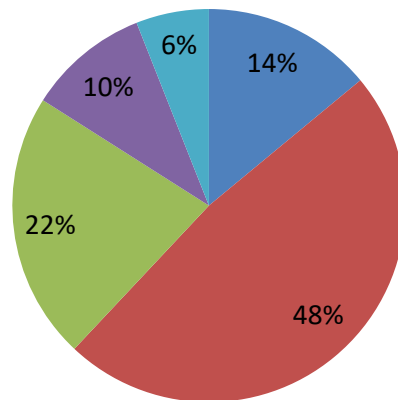

4. The new AIIMS are proposed to be funded through Extra Budgetary Resources. The Mentor AIIMS will enter into agreement with the Lending organization, initially as per requirement. A Loan Form in this respect for funding through Higher Education Funding Agency (HEFA) is also enclosed for taking up necessary action in filling up necessary documents for processing of loan. However, in due course, responsibility with the assets and liabilities will be transferred to new AIIMS as and when necessary administrative structures are in place in the new AIIMS.

5. The Mentor Institute would take up any other duties/responsibilities in the mentoring role as may be required for operationalization of these AIIMS.

ISSUES REQUIRING INVOLVEMENT OF MENTOR INSTITUTE IN THE INITIAL STAGES

1. Director, DDA and Financial Advisor of the Mentor Institutes would also be holding the corresponding charges of the Mentee AIIMS till appointment of regular incumbents, against the substantive posts to be created and filled in the Mentee Institutions.
2. Mentor Institute will support in early operationalization of OPD and MBBS batch for the Mentee Institutes. In this regard, Funds would be released to the Mentor Institutes which regular DDA and FA till such time a regular administrative and Financial structure is in place in the new Institutes.
  - All the fund requirement for early operationalization of the Mentee Institute would be released with the concurrence of Financial Advisor and Approval of Director of the Mentor Institute.
3. Various Statutory approvals like approval of Design of Radiotherapy bunkers, etc. from Atomic Energy Regulatory Board (AERB), etc. are required during the process of establishment of AIIMS, which can be obtained by the staff of AIIMS only. The Mentoring AIIMS needs to support the new AIIMS for seeking such approvals till a regular mechanism is put in place in the new AIIMS to obtain such approvals.
