

#### **Executive Director & CEO Review**



I feel privileged to present the 2<sup>nd</sup> Annual Report and Audited Statements of Accounts for the year 2021-22 of AIIMS Jammu. I am honoured to have been given the opportunity to be the Founder Executive Director & CEO of AIIMS Jammu.

I took over the charge as Executive Director & CEO on 19<sup>th</sup> April 2021. Prior to this from 12<sup>th</sup> April to 17<sup>th</sup> April 2021, I visited Jammu wherein, I had met the Hon'ble Lt Governor of Jammu & Kashmir, Shri Manoj Sinha and Shri Atul Dullo, Financial Commissioner (Health) UT of Jammu & Kashmir. I received institutional support and valuable guidance from them. I also visited the AIIMS Vijaypur Jammu site to assess the progress of construction, receed various locations for identifying appropriate site for making makeshift arrangements for accommodation and teaching of students and to identify site for establishment of the Camp Office of AIIMS at Jammu.

I feel proud to share with you the events/activities associated with AIIMS Jammu during 2021-22.

## Makeshift Campuses:- AIIMS Jammu:

A temporary Camp Office was established at Government Medical College, Doctor's Guest House, Maheshpura Chowk, Jammu on 07<sup>th</sup> July 2021. The first meeting of the Institute Body and constitution of Governing Body and Statutory Committees were done on 19<sup>th</sup> August 2021 and the website of AIIMS Jammu was also launched. A temporary makeshift campus was also established at

NITS, Miran Sahib, Jammu for teaching and living accommodation of undergratude MBBS students of AIIMS Jammu.

#### Manpower:

A total of 32 contractual faculty were recruited to fill in the gap of the faculty requirement for teaching and hospital project management. I feel proud to share with you that even during the Covid-19 pandemic these faculty did yeoman service and ensured continuity of teaching and project activities. It was heartening to observe the faculty actively engaging themselves in meaningful scientific research and projects even before the commissioning of the Institute. Twenty-Seven (27) research papers were published in the year 2021-22 and mainly in journals of high research value.

#### MoUs:

A number of MoUs were signed during 2021-22. These included the following:

- a) MOU with IIT Jammu, IIM Jammu, AIIMS Jammu & University of Jammu on 28th August 2021. A distinctive collaborative programme MBA (HA & HM) has been started as a first of its kind, by three Institutes of National importance i.e. IIM Jammu, AIIMS Jammu and IIT Jammu. The program was inaugurated in October, 2021 by the Hon'ble Union Home Minister Shri Amit Shah, Shri Dharmendra Pradhan, Union Minister HRD, Dr Jitendra Singh (Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Earth Sciences, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Science & Technology, Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, Minister of State in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Minister of State in the Department of Atomic Energy and Minister of State in the Department of Space) & Shri Manoj Sinha, Lt Governor of UT of Jammu and Kashmir in the presence of other renowned dignitaries at Jammu.
- b) MoU between AIIMS Jammu and CSIR-IIIM Jammu in presence of Hon'ble Minister Dr Jitendra Singh (Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Earth Sciences, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Science

- & Technology, Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, Minister of State in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Minister of State in the Department of Atomic Energy and Minister of State in the Department of Space) on 29<sup>th</sup> January 2022
- c) MoU with Institutes of National and International Importance (University of Alabama at Birmingham & Himalayan Research Institute for Yoga and Naturopathy (KAYAKALP)) on 07<sup>th</sup> March 2022.

#### **Project:**

The Cabinet of Government of India approved the proposal for establishment of AIIMS- Jammu at Vijaypur, District- Samba under Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojna (PMSSY) in January 2019. The foundation stone for AIIMS - Jammu project was laid by Shri Narendra Modi, Hon'ble Prime Minister on 03.02.2019.

The work was entrusted to Central Public Works Department for execution. The A/A & E/S amounting to Rs 1661 Cr (Rs 1404 Cr for Construction for Hospital, Medical College and other Infrastructure + Rs. 257 Cr for Medical Equipment and Furniture) was issued by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare (MoH& FW) in March 2019 with Target date of commissioning September 2023. Initial funds to the tune of Rs 80 Cr for establishment of AIIMS was made available by MoH&FW through HEFA (Higher Education Financing Agency), but after that fund is made available by MoH&FW through GBS (Government Budgetary system).

AIIMS Jammu site is located at **National Highway 44** which divides the total campus having areas **226.84** acres into Two Campus. North Campus of **96.90** acres will house **Hospitals and Academic Buildings** and South Campus of **129.95** acres will house **Hostels and Staff Housing**, both campuses will be connected by underpass. As per cabinet approved Detailed Project Report (DPR), the construction of River Protection work along Devak River is to be done

by State Irrigation Department and the construction of Underpass is being done by **National Highways Authority of India** (NHAI).

AllMS Jammu Bhoomi Poojan ceremony occurred on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2020. It was done by **Dr Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Union Minister of State (Independent Charge)** of the Ministry of Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of the Earth Sciences; MOS in Prime Minister's Office and Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions; Department of Atomic Energy; and Department of Space, Government of India, in the august presence of **Shri Jugal Kishore Sharma**, Hon'ble MP Jammu, **Shri Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar**, Advisor to Hon'ble Lieutenant Governor Jammu & Kashmir and **Padma Shri Professor Ravi Kant**, Director, AIIMS Rishikesh. The work of comprehensive consultancy for AIIMS Jammu (phase -1) was entrusted to **M/S ARCOP Associate Pvt. Ltd, Delhi**. The work was awarded with date of commencement **22.02.2020 to M/S Ahluwalia Contract (India) Limited. The revised target date of completion is September 2023** with the increase in the manpower from 500- 3500 workers working 24x7 to achieve the target. The Salient features of Project are

- 1. The total construction area in phase -1 is 2,25,205 sq m with development of whole premises, infrastructure civil and electrical facilities.
- 750 Bedded hospital building will have provision of MRI, CT, PET Scan, Nuclear Medicine, Modular OT, ICU, Super Specialty departments, OPD, Trauma Beds.
- 3. 30 Bedded Two Storey Ayush Block.
- 4. Academic Building includes Medical College for 125 students per year and Nursing College for 60 students per year.
- Total 230 staff housing from T-II to T-VII in multi storied towers and Director Bungalow, provision of UG Boys & Girls Hostel, PG Boys and Girls Hostel, PG Married Hostel and Nursing Hostel.
- 6. All the buildings are designed with provision of Seismic Zone 5

- 7. Provision of Helipad for catering to serious and accidental patients to be shifted by Air Ambulance to AIIMS Jammu.
- 8. Barrier Free Environment.
- 9. Provision for Sports Club, Cricket Stadium, Basketball Court, Lawn Tennis Court, Squash Court etc.
- 10. Provision of Surface Parking for 3300 ECS (Equivalent car space)
- 11. Provision of Night Shelter for attendants, having capacity of 256 nos.
- 12. A Guest House facility having capacity of 26 nos.
- 13. Both Campuses will be connected through 2 motor able and 2 Pedestrian Underpass.
- 14. Provision for 2 Additional Pedestrian Crossing is also kept at different locations for staff and students' movement.
- 15. Use of new and emerging technology like Glass Fibre Reinforced Concrete (GFRC) / Glass Reinforced Concrete (GRC) Cladding System, plastic Roads, Roof Top Solar PV Panels, Solar Poles.
- 16. Inverter type compressor and electronically communicated (EC) fan-based precision air conditioning, Ceiling Fans with Brushless DC (BLDC) Motor etc.
- 17. The whole campus is being developed for Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment (GRIHA) 4-star rating. Sustainable development is a requisite for future generation, as increasing urbanization, destruction of natural resources by anthropic activities, degrading ecosystems for the sake of present economic development at cost of environmental exploitation are increasing by each passing day on earth. GRIHA (Green Rating for Integrated Habitat Assessment) was established by TERI and adopted by the Government of India as the national rating system for green buildings in 2007. The framework has been created to assist in the 'design and assessment' of new construction projects. A building is evaluated based on its expected performance over its entire life cycle, from conception to service. To achieve 4-star rating in phase 1 project, following provision kept: -

- (a) Use of Autoclaved aerated concrete (AAC) Blocks in masonry.
- (b) Low water consumption fixtures.
- (c) Recycled water for flushing & Gardening.
- (d) Rain water harvesting system. There are many advantages in using rainwater harvesting. First, the water is free, as the cost is for the collection and use. Rainwater may be used to augment groundwater and surface water as necessary, particularly when water is in short supply. It provides a zero-hardness, no salt solution, which extends the life of equipment.
- (e) Use of Low Volatile Organic Compounds (VOC) points.
- (f) Low U-factor and low solar factor glass for facade.
- (g) Low wastage electrical fixtures and High efficiency motors.
- (h) Barrier Free Environment- all building will be accessible to all.
- (i) Provision of 1.075 Million Litres per Day (MLD) Sewage Treatment Plant.

   For effective monitoring of Electrical Parameters, Energy management and Energy Conservation. Supervisory control and data acquisition (SCADA) is

a control system architecture compromising computers, networked data communication and graphical user interface (GUI) for high-level process supervisory management, while also comprising other peripheral devices like programmable logic controllers (PLC) and discrete proportional integral-derivative (PDI) controllers to interface with process plant or machinery.

#### 5. Central Air conditioning (High Efficiency Centrifugal type AC plant).

- (a) 4x 800 TR Capacity (working) + 1x 800 TR (Standby)
  Total Capacity=**4000TR**.
- (b) 100 H.P VRV (Variable Refrigerant Volume) For Club & Guest House.
- (c) Precision Type Air Conditioning- For Data/Server Room.
- (d) Building Management System (BMS) For Energy Management and Conservation. Building Management System (BMS) based control system that needs to be installed within buildings to monitor and regulate the building's electrical and mechanical equipment such as power system, lightening, and ventilation to confirm sustainability. A building energy management system (BMS or BEMS) is based on a network of controllers and offers closer control and monitoring of building services performance, including cooling, heating, ventilation and air conditioning. This is shown on a computer screen in real time and allows settings to be changed quickly and easily. BEMS can reduce total energy cost by 10% or more so they are well worth considering. Buildings in particular are infused with devices connected to the Internet creating a network of connected pervasive things, namely the Internet of Things (IoT).

#### 6. Lifts.

Regenerative Type Passenger cum beds lifts and service lifts (82 No's)

(Regenerative drives capture the heat generated by elevators during use and convert it into reusable energy for the building rather than wasting it as heat).

- (a) Wet riser and sprinkler system For Hospital and Ayush Block
- (b) Wet riser system- For all Academic Block.
- (c) Down comer System For all Residential Building including Hostels& Dining.
- (d) Addressable type Fire Alarm System for Hospital, Academic, Ayush and Auditorium Buildings.
- (e) Manual fire Alarm System-For Residential Buildings including
- (f) Hostels and Dining.
- (g) LED exit signage's.

#### 8. Data Networking, Wi-Fi, Access Control System and CCTV

For Non-Residential and Residential buildings.

#### 9. Solar Panel as per GRIHA rating.

- 1. 150 KWP Grid interactive Solar PV System is to be provided.
- 2. Solar poles for street lighting.

#### 10. Medical System

- i. Medical Gas Pipeline System (MGPS). An MGPS is designed to provide a safe and effective method of delivering the required medical gas from the source of supply through a pipeline system to the patient via a terminal unit. Each medical gas must be supplied from a separate system, and it is essential that all parts of each system are gas specific to ensure that there is no possibility of cross-connection between any systems. During the installation stage, extensive tests are carried out to verify that there is no cross-connection.
- ii. **Modular Operation Theatres (MOT).** OT is the place in hospitals where medical professionals carry out interventional procedures in a sterile environment. A modular OT is an upgraded version of the OT in which seamless integration of systems having ceiling panels and modular walls is done. Modular operation theatre focuses on achieving safety, precision, and efficiency for the entire operating team. It is designed to

- streamline the workflow and deliver better patient outcomes by eliminating wasted time and resources. Modular operating theatre drives consistency and smooth flow during operations, reducing the risk while carrying out surgical procedures.
- iii. Nurse Call System (NCS). Studies suggest that patient-related communication consumes 9.9% of nursing time and that "looking for someone" was the predominant nursing activity. The new two-way wireless communication system improved staff communication reduced environmental noise, and enhanced worker satisfaction and patient comfort. As health care organizations further decrease operating costs, communication modalities (specifically nurse call systems) will assume an increasingly important role in the health care delivery process and the cost-quality ratio. The NCS eradicates the frustration of patients to call the nurses. The system eases the management of patient related services like medicines and emergency calls.
- iv. Pneumatic Tube System (PTS). There is a growing need of integrated healthcare system for providing seamless care to the patients, reducing manual work, and improving efficiency. PTS is one such advanced microprocessor-based system of transportation that combines speed with reliability in numerous logistical needs. These are highly complex systems, which are used for a variety of small and medium-sized tasks.
- v. Automated Waste & Laundry System (AWLS). Automated, pneumatic systems take waste, recycling and soiled linen from multiple points in hospital facility and whisk it away to central locations entirely out of sight of the patients, guests and customers. This pneumatic conveying technology is quietly behind the walls and underground in continuous, 24/7 operation as it automatically streamlines the collection, transport and removal of laundry and refuse. Housekeeping traffic through the facility is reduced along with associated staffing and equipment costs. Unsightly tilt trucks despoiling otherwise stunning architecture remain up on the floor. Germs and odours are contained in a single HVAC zone.

- **11. Audio –Video System:** For all Class Rooms, Conference Hall and Auditorium.
- 12. Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) / Effluent Treatment Plant (ETP). Sewage from the hospital comes from various areas of hospitals like ICU, emergency room, canteen, laboratory and, from many other areas. Hospital sewage contains elements that have bad effect on environment as well as human beings. Therefore, its treatment is necessary. The treatment of effluents is essential to prevent pollution of the receiving water, to reduce the possibility of pollution and; biodegradable organics if left unsolved, the levels of contamination in the process of purification could damage bacterial treatment beds and lead to pollution of controlled waters. The proposed Sewage treatment Plant of 660 KLD Approx. (600 KLD Sewage + 60 KLD Effluent) for Hospital Side & 375 KLD capacity for Residential Side shall be with MBR Technology or improved version, as applicable, and shall include the ETP discharged of 60 KLD (approx.) for Hospital. The total capacity is 1075 KLD.

#### 13. Water Supply System

Bore wells are proposed for AIIMS site and it is to be done by the PHE Department of J&K. **Hydro- pneumatic** Pumps are taken for distribution of water supply to various buildings.

#### Infrastructure which has been established at site: -

- Two batching plant (60 cum/ hr in North Parcel & 30 cum/ hr in South Parcel).
- 2. Computer Numeric Control (CNC) Machine for stirrups cutting and bending.
- 3. 16 nos of tower cranes.
- 4. 20 KI capacity diesel dump to reduce carbon foot print.
- 5. Labour huts of 3000 capacity with all the facility.
- Establishment of Safety Park for daily safety pep-talks and demonstrations.

- Establishment of Community Health Care Centre with dedicated MBBS
  doctor to provide holistic care and giving exposure to medical students to
  understand needs of the community.
- 8. Establishment of various storage yards.
- 9. Establishment of fully equipped Quality labs.
- Training centre for Skill development Programme under National Skill Development Programme.
- 11. Establishment of Tyre washing area to minimize dust outside.
- 12. 12-meter height barricading along NH & 3-meter height barricading at complete periphery.

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# ALL INDIA INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES VIJAYPUR, JAMMU

#### **Introduction:**

All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Vijaypur, Jammu is one amongst the several new AIIMS, being established under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India. The short-term objective of establishing new AIIMS in various parts of India is to reduce the 'gaps' in affordable Tertiary Healthcare and long-term vision is to generate 'wellness' amongst the general population of India. AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu is under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY). It came into existence as an Institute of National Importance through Central Government Gazette Notification dated 04<sup>th</sup> December 2019. Establishment of AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu has been done under PMSSY (Phase-V) in a bid to correct regional imbalance in availability of affordable /reliable Tertiary Healthcare services and to cater for people residing in far flung areas of UT of Jammu & Kashmir, adjoining regions of Punjab, Himachal Pradesh and rest of the country.

The foundation stone of AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu was laid by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji on 03rd February 2019. It was followed by Bhoomi Poojan Ceremony by Dr Jitendra Singh, Hon'ble Minister of State (Independent Charge) of the Ministry of Earth Sciences, Minister of State (Independent Charge) of Science & Technology, Minister of State in the Prime Minister's Office, Minister of State in the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Minister of State in the Department of Atomic Energy and Minister of State in the Department of Space, Government of India on 13th February 2020. AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu is still in its construction phase as in year 2020-21 and progressing satisfactorily with increase of manpower from 500 labours (due to COVID-19 pandemic) to approximately 3500 labours, working day and night to complete the project before the target date (photographs of progress of construction activities as on 15<sup>th</sup> April 2021 & **06<sup>th</sup> March 2022 is attached as Annexure for perusal please).** AllMS, Vijaypur, Jammu shall be a 750 bedded hospital in phase-I, with multiple specialities as well as super speciality departments (32 specialty and 18 super speciality departments). The project cost of construction is about 1661 crores, which includes an allocation of Rs 185 crores towards state-of-the-art medical equipment. The Government of Jammu has allotted about 227 acres of land (including expansion for phase-II & phase-III of the Institute) for the project and shall take care of access roads, water facilities and provision of electricity connection.

- 2. Research in biomedical sciences; and
- 3. Patient care at the highest care level

The objective of AIIMS as mentioned in the AIIMS Act 1956 (as amended) is as follows:-

- 1) To develop patterns of teaching in under-graduate and post graduate medical education in all its branches so as to demonstrate a high standard of medical education to all medical colleges and other allied Institutions of India.
- 2) To bring together in one place education facilities of the highest order for the training of personal in all branches of health activities.
- 3) To attain self-sufficiency in post-graduate medical education.




Figure -1: Governance Structure

Separate Audit Report of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India on the Accounts of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Vijaypur, Jammu for the year ended 31st March 2022

We have audited the Balance Sheet of All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Vijaypur, Jammu as on 31st March 2022, Income and Expenditure Account and Receipts and Payments Account for the year ended on that date under Section 19(2) of the Comptroller and Auditor General's (Duties, Power and Conditions of Service) Act, 1971 read with Section 18 (2) of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS) Act, 1956.

- 2. This Separate Audit Report contains the comments of the Comptroller & Auditor General of India (CAG) on the accounting treatment only with regard to classification, conformity with the best accounting practices, accounting standards and disclosure norms, etc. Audit observations on financial transactions with regard to compliance with the Law, Rules & Regulations (Propriety and Regularity) and efficiency-cum-performance aspects, etc., if any, are reported through Inspection Reports/ CAG's Audit Reports separately.
- 3. We have conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in India. These standards require that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidences supporting the amounts and disclosure in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of financial statements. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion.
- 4. Based on our audit, we report that:
- i) We have obtained all the information and explanations, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- ii) The Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account/Receipt and Payment Account dealt with by this Report have been drawn up in the Uniform format prescribed by the Ministry of Finance, Government of India;
- iii) In our opinion, proper books of accounts and other relevant records have been maintained by the All India Institute of Medical Sciences, Vijaypur, Jammu in so far as it appears from our examination of such books.

#### iv) We further report that:

#### A. Balance Sheet Liabilities

Corpus / Capital Fund (Schedule - 1) Rs. 85.60 crore

A.1 Above includes Rs. 32.03 crore (Rs. 30.65 crore unutilized grant received for HEFA Loan, Rs. 1.15 crore unutilized Capital grant received during 2021-22 and unutilized funds under the Grant in Aid – General (Rs. 0.17 crore) and Salary (Rs. 0.06 crore).). Since, these grants are yet to be utilized by the Institute, the same should have been disclosed separately under Earmarked/ Endowment Funds instead of treating it as Corpus / Capital Fund.

This has resulted in overstatement of Corpus / Capital Fund and understatement of Earmarked/ Endowment Funds by Rs. 32.03 crore

A.2 The Institute during the year 2020-21 paid interest amounting to Rs. 2.09 crore on the HEFA loan drawn for construction of AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu, and booked it as an expense during previous year. Since the AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu is under construction stage, the aforesaid interest should have been booked under Capital Work-in-Progress. This has resulted in understatement of Capital Work-in-progress as well as Corpus Fund by Rs. 2.09 crore.

## B. Income and Expenditure Account

Interest Earned Rs. 1.35 crore (Schedule 17)

Above represents the interest earned during the year by the Institute on the grants received from Government of India.

In this regard, a reference is invited to General Financial Rule No. 230(8) as per which, all interests or other earnings against Grants in aid or advances (other than reimbursement) released to any Grantee institution should be mandatorily remitted to the Consolidated Fund of India immediately after finalization of the accounts.

The Institute has booked the above-mentioned interest earned as income instead of treating it as a liability, which is not in order. Similar comment was also issued in the Separate Audit Report for the year 2020-21 in respect of Interest amounting Rs. 1.85 crore. However, compliance for the same was not made.

This has resulted in overstatement of Capital / Corpus Fund and understatement by Current Liabilities by Rs. 3.20 crore (1.35 + 1.85), besides overstatement of current year's income by Rs. 1.35 crore.

#### C. Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to the Accounts

C.1 A reference is invited to the Institute's Significant Accounting Policy No. 3A.3 which states that, land for which payments have been made directly to State Government (J&K) by the Ministry of Health & Welfare have not been shown in the books of accounts.

The land has been directly transferred from the J&K Government to Ministry of Health and Family Welfare on free of cost basis. In this regard, a reference is invited to AS-12, which states that Government Grants may take the form of non-monetary assets such as land or other resources, given at concessional rates. In these circumstances, it is usual to account for such assets at their acquisition cost. Non-monetary assets given free of cost are recorded at a nominal value.

Thus the accounting policy of the Institute is not as per the prescribed guidelines as mentioned above.

C.2 AIIMS Jammu Project Division was showing the receipt of total deposit of Rs. 653.33 crore for the works of AIIMS Vijaypur, against which amount of Rs. 540.08 crore had been utilised by CPWD on various works executed at AIIMS Vijaypur upto 31.3.2022. However, against the above transactions, the Institute has only accounted for expenditure of Rs. 50.00 crore as CWIP (against the advance of Rs. 50.00 crore released by the Institute). The remaining expenditure and capital advance has neither been accounted for in the books of accounts nor the fact and figures were disclosed in the Notes to the Accounts. The Accounts of the Institute and CPWD need to be reconciled with each other.

#### D. General

#### D.1 Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts

Net impact of Audit comments on the Annual Accounts of All India Institute of Medical Science, Vijaypur, Jammu for the year ending 31 March 2022 is as under:

- Assets understated by Rs. 2.09 crore.
- ii. Liabilities understated by Rs. 35.23 crore.

- iii. Capital/ Corpus Fund overstated by Rs. 33.14 crore (including understatement of deficit of the year 2021-22 by 1.35 crore).
- D.2 Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare vide its order dated 11 February 2021 appointed AIIMS, Delhi as the Mentor Institute of AIIMS, Vijaypur, Jammu. Accordingly, the Academic session for the year 2021-22 was conducted by AIIMS, New Delhi on behalf of the AIIMS, Jammu. However, the revenue earned from Fees / Subscriptions from the students and corresponding expenditure incurred by AIIMS, New Delhi for the students enrolled for

AIIMS, Jammu was not accounted for in the books of account as the details of the same

D.3 As per GFR 211 (ii) (a), Fixed Asset Register is required to be maintained in form GFR 22. Though the Institute has maintained the Fixed Asset Register, but the same has not been maintained in the proper format, as certain prescribed information such as details of supplier, bill, cost and location of the asset was not found recorded in the Register.





## **State-wise Distribution (MBBS Batch 2020-21)**






